

PROTOCOL FOR NATIONAL WEBSITES 28mar08 issue1

Preamble

The national website should be set up to serve those nationals working on the research and technology related to community noise from aircraft.

Where 'national' is used in sections 1. to 5., also normally read 'regional'. See section 6. for regional considerations.

1. **Where the national website should be located & under whose control**

The national website should be set up to serve those nationals working on the research and technology related to community noise from aircraft.

It should be set up as a separate website or a separately identifiable part of a bigger related website.

It should be reachable directly from the main European website, www.xnoise.eu .

It should be under the control of the National Focal Point or deputy (in the case of a deputy, their contact details should be notified to the X-Noise Website Manager).

2. **Relationship to the main European website, www.xnoise.eu**

The national website should provide a forum and location for information of national interest in the specific area of research and technology on community noise associated with aircraft.

It should not attempt to duplicate the main website, but should encourage use of the resources on the latter by many links to it.

3. **Who can access the national website**

Only members of the national group, who have registered to join and been accepted by the National Focal Point. In general, this should be restricted to nationals working on the research and technology related to community noise from aircraft.

4. **What should be on the national website**

It is important to assist in the development of the main website and for the local national website to provide information mainly of a local and national nature.

This local and national information should include – *News, Events, Research, Links*. Frequent links should be made to the main website for all these items to avoid unnecessary duplication.

An External Welcome/Information About page or pages – this/these should be viewable by members of the public, who then can realize that the national website exists, go to another page indicating how to contact the NFP and/or apply for registration and login. The main website, www.xnoise.eu, is already set up to point to NFP and national website. The latter can be associated with a specific national page on www.xnoise.eu, if required. For countries that cannot easily host their own websites, a skeleton national website may also be able to be accommodated on the main www.xnoise.eu site.

Login – specifically available only to those who have been included by the NFP on setting up the national website or later on have applied for national registration and been accepted by the NFP.

Registration - restricted to nationals working on the research and technology related to community noise from aircraft.

After logging in -

Internal Welcome & Objectives Page

National X3-Noise Deliverables

Planning & Record of local NFP arranged meetings and workshops of national interest mainly

National Research – Planning & Actual; Links to European Research summarized in the main website, www.xnoise.eu

Links to National Bodies/Organisations; Link to the main website www.xnoise.eu for further links

National registered participants addresses including e-mails – the addresses should normally be completely hidden except to the NFP and/or deputy and/or administrator; the e-mails should be hidden from external users.

Additionally, NFPs are asked to assist in Professional Registration for the main website, www.xnoise.eu, by providing on request from the main Website Manager information on the acceptability of applications from the NFP's nation for such Professional Registration.

5. What should not be on the website

It is important to assist in the development of the main website and to provide information for links of general European community noise from aircraft interest, so you are requested, please, not to duplicate the main website, instead you are asked to include on your national website your few extras of particular national interest, to propose generally interesting links to the Manager of the main Website Manager, www.xnoise.eu, and to point to the main website for the rest.

Personal information needs to be protected.

6. Regional considerations

Regional focal points will be expected to set up a website on similar lines to a national. In practice, it is appreciated that this may have to be combined with separate websites that may have to exist in separate countries, with national separate arrangements for login and registration.
